

Expectations for the Future

- EU-wide framework for mutual degree recognition and joint accreditation.
- Ensure long-term funding in line with strategic priorities of the Alliances and their impact for Europe
- Eligibility for funding should not be determined by the programme, but by the priorities set and the impact to be achieved.
- Streamline reporting requirements and create a single, harmonized administrative framework
- Implement an EU-wide communication strategy to promote alliances to students, staff, and external partners
- Establish dedicated EU funding for IT infrastructure in university alliances
- Proposal by DRAGHI: ERC for Institutions (EIC-I) competing with alliances
